

Waste Management Policy Statement

Effective from November 2025 **Review date** June 2026

MJ Gleeson PLC is committed to improving its environmental performance and reducing environmental impacts. We build quality affordable homes, where they are needed and for the people who need them the most. We often build on brownfield sites, regenerating land and communities which compliments the surrounding environment. We build homes, we change lives.

In accordance with MJ Gleeson Group Environmental Policy Statement, we have committed to protect the environment and prevent pollution.

Incorrect waste management can have a significant impact on the environment directly through processing and indirectly through unnecessary waste of natural resources, materials and products.

We commit to comply with all applicable waste regulations and legislation. We ensure that the waste hierarchy is followed and we work in partnership with our waste service provider ensuring all waste is collected by a licenced waste carrier and processed by a licenced waste facility for both hazardous and non-hazardous waste. All documentation is retained for the required periods.

Our waste consists of the following streams:

- Dry mixed recycling
- Plaster board
- Wood
- General municipal waste
- Construction & demolition waste
- Hazardous generally limited to packaging containing hazardous residues e.g. adhesives, sealants & paint tins
- Soils & stones ("muck shift")

The vast majority of waste generated (>99%) is diverted form landfill through a combination of recycling and energy recovery, and a very small amount sent to anaerobic digestion, with the remaining <1% of waste being sent to landfill. However, we recognise that we need go further to reduce waste being generated in the first instance.



We commit to:

- Satisfy the waste hierarchy.
- Ensure compliance with all waste legislation, regulation & duty of care.
- Set waste reduction targets.
- Maximise recycling and optimisation opportunities.
- Where waste cannot be recycled, recover energy through incineration to achieve >99% diversion from landfill.
- Work with our supply chain partners to understand how upstream packaging waste can be avoided and / or reduced.
- Work with our waste service partners and material suppliers to identify circular opportunities.
- Provide continual training for colleagues to reduce waste and ensure waste is managed in accordance with all applicable legislation.
- To promote environmental awareness in order to increase and encourage waste minimisation, reuse and recycling.
